# Item No. To place before the Finance Committee the matter regarding Write-off of Non-Repairable/Damaged /Unserviceable UPS and Batteries.

To dispose-off Non-Repairable/Damaged/Unserviceable UPS and Batteries lying in various campuses of the university, a committee was constituted vide O/o No. 3-6/हि.प्र.के.वि./सा.प्र./2010/खंड-II/5178-81 dated 19th September, 2022.

The Committee initiated the process to dispose-off the Non-Repairable/Damaged/Unserviceable UPS and Batteries as per provisions contained in the GFR-2017. Further, a technical sub-committee was constituted vide NP 72-84 of case file No. 6-4/CUHP/ENGG/2020/A dated 17.10.2024 to inspect the aforesaid material. The meeting of technical sub-committee was convened on 04.12.2024 and the said committee submitted its Inspection Report on dated 06.12.2024. The said material again inspected on dated 11.02.2025 in the presence of external expert Sh. Kirti Azad, J.E. Electrical, Himachal Pradesh State Electricity Board. The external expert also recommended that the said material can be disposed off as per rules.

In view the inspection report of technical sub-committee alongwith external expert (member), the Non-Repairable/Damaged/Unserviceable UPS and Batteries were declared condemned by the Committee Members.

Further, it is submitted that the book value of Non-Repairable/ Damaged/ Unserviceable UPS and Batteries as per books of accounts is detailed out below:-

### Item No. 45.7

To place before the Finance Committee, the matter regarding Engagement of Academic and Finance Consultant.

- 1. The Finance Committee is appraised that the Central University of Himachal Pradesh aims to strengthen its academic planning, institutional research output, and financial management practices in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and other regulatory frameworks.
- 2. In this context, the University proposes to engage external experts as 'Academic & Finance Consultant' to provide strategic support in areas such as curriculum design, accreditation (NAAC/NIRF), faculty development, academic audits, management of outside consultant and Research Project, further to assist with improving financial planning, UGC funding utilization, statutory compliances, and capacity building of finance personnel.
- 3. The consultants would be engaged purely on contract basis initially for a period of six months which may further be extended on performance basis.
- 4. It is submitted that the entire matter was placed before the Academic Council vide item No. 40.29 in its  $40^{th}$  meeting held on 18.08.2025 for according its approval on the followings:
  - a. Approval for engagement of one 'Academic and Finance Consultant' purely on contract basis initially for a period of six months which may further be extended on performance basis.
  - b. Authorization to the Vice-Chancellor to constitute a Committee for identification and recommendation of suitable personnel for engagement as 'Academic and Finance Consultant'.
  - c. Finalization of remuneration and contractual terms.
- 5. The Academic Council after deliberations upon the entire matter has approved to the following:

The Academic Council after deliberations at length approved the aforesaid proposal and desired to take up the matter in the Finance Committee.

The Chairman apprised the Members that two Consultants i.e. one for Academic purpose and one for Financial purpose are required for smooth functioning of the day to day activities of the University. After detailed deliberations one of the Member i.e. Director (IFD), Ministry of Education advised that the retired officers well versed with the functioning of the University may be engaged for these purposes.

The Finance Committee considered the proposal and recommended for approval of the Executive Council to engage the one Academic Consultant



and one Finance Consultant and authorized the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor for engagement of these Consultants. The Honorarium/Remuneration shall be fixed in conformity of O.M. No. 3-25/2020-E-IIIA dated 9<sup>th</sup> December, 2020.

### Recommended for approval of the Executive Council.

### Item No. 45.8

To place before the Finance Committee the matter regarding establishment of Astronomical Observatory in collaboration with the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and payment of Net Present Value (NPV) for diversion of forest land.

The matter regarding establishment of Astronomical Observatory in collaboration with the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) and payment of Net Present Value (NPV) for diversion of forest land was placed before the Academic Council vide 40.26 in its  $40^{th}$  Meeting held on 18.08.2025 as under:-

"It is submitted before the Academic Council that the University, in collaboration with the Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO), is in the process of establishing an Astronomical Observatory at the University's permanent campus, Jadrangal, District Kangra, Himachal Pradesh. This project, with an investment commitment involving an amount of ₹42 Crores by ISRO, is of national prestige and holds strategic importance as the only major astronomical facility in North India under ISRO's Space Situational Awareness Programme. The Hon'ble Prime Minister has, on various occasions, emphasized the significance of advancing India's space capabilities and promoting scientific research in alignment with the vision of Viksit Bharat@2047.

For the establishment of this observatory, the State Government of Himachal Pradesh has conveyed its readiness to allot 0.5 hectare (approximately 16–17 kanal) of forest land in favour of CUHP. As per the provisions of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, and CAMPA guidelines, the University is required to deposit an amount of ₹13,47,615/- (Rupees Thirteen Lakh Forty-Seven Thousand Six Hundred Fifteen only) towards Net Present Value (NPV) for the diversion of the said forest land. It is proposed that the said payment amounting to ₹13,47,615/- be made from the overhead charges of the ISRO project, with the understanding that the amount will be reimbursed once the project funds are fully received. Completion of the land diversion process at the earliest is essential to enable ISRO to commence infrastructure development for the observatory without delay".

The Academic Council approved as under:-

"The Academic Council appreciated the efforts of the university in this regard. To see the academic importance and sensitivity of the matter, the Academic Council after deliberation decided to deposit the aforesaid amount. The Council further directed the Finance Officer to examine and necessary action be initiated."

In pursuance to the decision of the Academic Council, the matter has been examined by the Finance Department and it has been observed that the establishment of an astronomical observatory in collaboration with ISRO is of national prestige and holds strategic importance as the only major astronomical facility in North India under ISRO's Space Situational Awareness Programme. In this context, a **Memorandum of Understanding** has been signed between ISRO & CUHP for assessing the feasibility of Establishing Optical Observational Facilities in the State of Himachal Pradesh. The excerpts of which are as follows:-



#### Article 4 - Responsibilities.

#### 4.1 CUHP shall be responsible

- 4.1.1. For identification of land in the State of Himachal Pradesh.
- 4.1.2. For procuring capital items required for the Study.
- 4.1.3. For studying site parameters through astronomical observations.

#### 4.2 ISRO shall be responsible

4.2.1. For bearing the expenditure for point 3.2 and 3.3.

#### Article 3.2 and 3.3 states as under:-

- 3.2. Procurement of capital items required for the study like All Sky Camera, Automatic Weather Station, Portable Laptop and Storage.
- 3.3. Study site parameters through astronomical observations.

Therefore, as per MoU Article 4.1.1, it is the responsibility of the Central University of Himachal Pradesh for identification of land in the State of Himachal Pradesh. In view of the MoU and the importance of this observatory, the University may deposit the NPV amounting to ₹13,47,615/- through online CAMPA Account from the Internal Resources of the University, so that land can be transferred in the name of Central University of Himachal Pradesh.

The Finance Committee deliberated upon the proposal and after detailed discussion, it was observed that the establishment of an astronomical observatory in collaboration with ISRO is of national prestige in North India. Accordingly, the Finance Committee considered the proposal and recommended to deposit the NPV amounting to ₹13,47,615/- from the Internal Resources of the University, so that land can be transferred in the name of Central University of Himachal Pradesh. Recommended for approval of Executive Council.

### Item No. 45.9

To place before the Finance Committee the proposal regarding Drawing & Disbursing Officer (DDO) of CUHP.

The Finance Committee in its  $27^{th}$  Meeting held on 10.06.2020 vide Item No. 27.2 (T) declared that the Finance Officer shall be the Drawing Disbursing Officer in respect of all the schemes operation in this University.

The authorized signatory for the issue of cheques, have been ordered as under:-

(i) All cheques of the University upto the amount of Rs.5.00 Lakhs (Rupees Five Lakhs only) shall be issued under the signatures of Assistant Registrar (Finance) henceforth. The Finance Officer shall continue to sign the cheques beyond Rs. 5.00 Lakhs alongwith Registrar as Co-Signatory.



Keeping in view the decision, it is proposed to amend above as under:-

- (i) All cheques/PPA/DSC of the University upto the amount of Rs.5.00 Lakhs (Rupees Five Lakhs only) shall be issued singly under the signatures of Deputy Registrar (Finance)/ Assistant Registrar (Finance).
- (ii) In the absence of, Deputy Registrar (Finance)/Assistant Registrar (Finance) all cheques/PPA/DSC of the University upto the amount of Rs.5.00 Lakhs (Rupees Five Lakhs only) shall be issued under the signatures of Finance Officer.
- (iii) The Finance Officer shall continue sign the cheques/PPA/DSC beyond Rs. 5.00 Lakhs alongwith Registrar as Co-Signatory.

# Item No. To place before the Finance Committee the matter regarding purchase of 45.10 New Multi Purpose Vehicle (MPV).

The Finance Committee is apprised that the Central University of Himachal Pradesh has scattered in three different campuses 50KM apart in the Hilly terrains. The University is also having three hostels for its students which are also scattered.

The Central University of Himachal Pradesh is the first in the nation who has implemented NEP-2020 in letter and spirit. The Swayam Courses and the various skill courses are the integral part of this NEP, 2020 for which mobilisation of the students is the utmost requirement for attending various practical's and other skill activities as an academic requirement.

The University is having limited transportational recourse and has to rely upon the private vendors for its transportational requirement. Most of the time the University has to compromise its administrative/academic activities for the want of its own transportational recourses. In order to meet out the transportational requirements of the University from time to time the University is in dire need of a New Multi Purpose Vehicle (MPV).

Thus the purchase proposals of vehicle is based on the principle of 'Need' and 'Want' and are in confirmation of GFR-2017 within ceiling prescribed by the Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance vide **O.M. No. F.1/26/2018-PPD dated 09th August, 2021** in order to cater the



requirements of the University, since, it is having its three scattered Campuses situated 50 kilometers apart in the Hilly terrain.

Comments of Ministry of Education (IFD) on Agenda Item 45.10 received vide letter No. F. No. 9-3/2018-IFD.Pt dated 18<sup>th</sup> September, 2025 through email dated 18<sup>th</sup> September, 2025, quote "Financial implication involved have not been provided. Therefore, detailed proposal with financial implication involved may be placed before FC for consideration".

Comments of UGC. New Delhi on Agenda Item on Agenda Item 45.10 received through email dated 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2025 vide letter No. 29-6/2017 (CU)/75994 dated 23<sup>rd</sup> September, 2025, quote "The Govt. of India orders on the purchase of vehicles may be kept in view while considering it. The University needs to follow the GFR and orders of Govt. of India at the time of procurement of goods and services.

The Finance Committee considered the proposal of purchase of new vehicle as per provisions contained in Rule-149 of GFR-2017 in terms of amendment conveyed vide Department of Expenditure OM No. 1/26/2018-PPD dated 09.08.2021 subject to availability of Capital Funds and recommended for the approval of the Executive Council.
